WYC Board secures historic agreement for harbour facility expansion!

LONG-TERM LEASE ON RIVERSIDE MARINA PROPERTY ALLOWS FOR WYC'S FUTURE GROWTH & DEVELOPMENT

At its regular meeting on Monday, January 20, the Windsor Yacht Club's Board of Directors was presented with an historic opportunity: the first chance in the Club's 83-year history to significantly develop and expand its harbour facilities. After a series of in-camera meetings with the Windsor Port Authority, during which a tentative lease agreement was negotiated, the Executive Committee was pleased to present the Board with an opportunity to assume management of the Riverside Marina property under a 60-year lease.

Commodore McMahon is delighted to announce that the proposal was unanimously approved by the Board, making this historic opportunity a reality for our Members and for local boaters.

In reporting the new arrangement, Commodore McMahon said "This is a historic opportunity for the Windsor Yacht Club to grow. Ultimately, we will have the ability to welcome more boaters and bolster our membership. It's a win-win situation and a very exciting time for our Club."

Toasting the agreement (with port, of course; see cover image) Steven Salmons, President and CEO of Port Windsor, was equally positive. "I enjoyed working on this with the WYC team; your experience and expertise were well beyond anything we usually have at our disposal here."

s I begin to write February's Log report, I again realize how quickly time flies by. It seems just like yesterday when we were all celebrating the Christmas holidays and the beginning of the New Year.

With the ever-changing weather patterns, the Yards and Docks Committee is closely monitoring the harbours to ensure minimal damage to the docks due to ice and the fluctuating water levels.

In January the Yards and Docks Committee reviewed all the 2020 well applications received. On or before February 15th the East and West Harbour well assignments will be posted. There were very few changes made; any well reassignments were based on the WYC Yards and Docks Rule # 2 which states "Wells are to be assigned by February 15th to those Members entitled to hold a boat well as allowed in Sections 2.04, 2.05 & 2.06 of the bylaws. First consideration for well assignment is given to a boat owner who had an assigned well the prior year in our harbour and has applied for a well for the same or comparable sized vessel. The well assignment may not necessarily be for the same well assigned the previous year. Assigned wells must meet the general principle that the boat suits the well with respect to length and beam, taking into consideration channel width and potential hazards."

I encourage any WYC Members who may have any questions or concerns regarding well assignments to contact me directly.



Memories Worth Sharing


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How long have you been a member of the WYC? Why did you join?
